- To identify the key skills and organisational features included in non-fiction texts.
- To write an informative travel brochure to entice tourists to Brazil.
- To write a persuasive letter about deforestation to the Brazilian government.



Geography

As geographers we will learn...

- To locate Brazil's key environmental regions on a map, including using an eight point compass and six-figure grid.
- To understand the similarities and differences between Brazil and the UK through the study of human and physical geography.
- To understand the key aspects of Brazil's physical geography including; climate zones, biomes and vegetation belts.



Maths

As mathematicians we will learn...

- To carry out calculations involving the four operations (including decimal numbers).
- To multiply simple pairs of proper fractions
- To calculate a percentage of an amount.
- To solve problems involving the calculation of percentages
- To convert between miles and kilometres
- To calculate the area and perimeter of geometric shapes, parallelograms and triangles
- To calculate the volume of simple 3D shapes (cubes and cuboids)
- To name parts of the circle and work out diameter and radius.

- To understand how to pass and move with speed in handball.




As dancers we will learn...
