	Leanne is absent, this will be moved to July.	
4.	Safeguarding Training	
	Allie and Sally shared CPOMS. Sally shared her role in the	
	school. Sally and Allie are the DSLs, followed by the Deputy	
	safeguarding leads.	
	2 levels on CPOMS: where DSLs get key holder information	
	as there is lots of sensitive information on the site.	
	Questions	
	A governor asked: Can you use this to track behaviour?	
	Allie replied: Yes, it has a report function, which you can	
	track behaviour.	
	A governor asked: Is it fit for purpose?	
	Allie replied: Yes, it is brilliant. At this time of year for	
	example, we can send, through via a click of a button, all the information to secondary schools for transition.	
	A governor asked: How do you prioritise what is coming	
	through?	
	Allie replied: If it is serious, staff know not to wait and log it,	
	but walk over to DSLs to inform them of the safeguarding	
	issue.	
	A governor asked: How long have you used this for?	
	Allie replied: 3-4 years, which was great during lockdown for	
	recording information, especially for members of staff who	
	were absent from school to ensure they were up-to-date	
	with communication that was going on in school.	

Sally explained her role: vulnerable pupils tracking from local authority. We used to create our own vulnerable list, but now the local authority now provide this, which is	
updated every 2 weeks. There are roughly 10% of children on the list. Therefore local authority will know who they are. Threshold is high in Portsmouth, so they don't get picked up as early in this county. As a result, at Copnor, we go above and beyond most schools in the city with the support we offer families. Being aware of the changing area, which has been exacerbated due to COVID, and will continue to happen. Money is tighter and agency support is less. If we don't do something, then the families will not get the support they need.	
Training: We ensure that we are up-to-date and keep a thorough list of who and what training needs are required.	
Questions: A governor asked: As child suicide is on the rise, has anyone had any suicide awareness training and triggers for this in school? Sally replied: No, but we will be looking into this. We have training for self-harm due to the need in school. CAHMS's threshold has increased which makes it harder to get support.	
A governor asked: This is emotionally draining, who do you (Sally) get support from? The only one with supervision training is Sally. Sally can off load to Allie. Strong relationships in schools allow members of staff to get support. However, equally, it is important not to normalise the incidents. The walking bus allows us to contact vulnerable families and improve their attendance. After school club also has welfare places to allow parents to work. We need to work with our community to get the best out of it.	
The Headteacher mentioned that the Pastoral Team is a real strength of this school as they always go above and beyond.

	A governor asked: Out of that, how many are EHCPs, SEN?	
	Headteacher replied: At least one. We will know pupil	
	premium (PP) children in the autumn term, when we hold	
	the 'Aspire Days' for Year R. We will set up laptop which will	
	show if they are eligible. We will then provide a book bag	
	free to parents who do this.	
	A governor asked: Is there eligibility for Year 3 pupils to be	
	PP?	
	Headteacher replied: We advertise this again to Year 3	
	parents to encourage them to apply for PP. He explained	
	the difference between free school meals and Ever 6.	
	As a school we have identified that the current Year 5 need	
	to go to four form entry due to the need in that year group.	
	A governor asked: Why is there no more-able data for KS1	
	pupils?	
	Headteacher explained: When you get the EYFS baseline,	
	you can only access them externally from KS1 SATs,	
	therefore they haven't had this data yet.	
	A governor asked: There are four exclusions – is this four	
	different children?	
	Headteacher replied: No, that is one child and they had 4	
	separate exclusions.	
	A governor asked: Will the child who is dual registered be	
	on role for a while?	
	Allie replied: Yes, until Year 4. If they do well, they will	
	return to mainstream, but they are unlikely to return here as	
	they would need a fresh start.	
	A governor asked: What are zones of regulation that are	
	being trialled in Year R?	
	Allie explained: It is about training our youngest children	
	with verbalising their emotional language and recognising	
	their emotions, which relates to certain colours. Then we	
	teach them strategies about how they can control their	
	emotions.

	Budget summary: Amendments have been put in to adjust against the rising cost of utilities. On the website there is more detail against the codes.	
	Questions: A Governor asked: How does the increase with petrol effect the budget? For example running the two minibuses.	
	Tracey replied: without the minibuses, the children wouldn't have their cultural capital. Also in comparison with hiring a coach, it is far cheaper. It is important to recognise this and it is noted. It is always important to shop around and get	
	the best quote. We have had discussions with staff regarding ways to save money, such as turning the interactive whiteboards off when the class is not in there.	
	A Governor asked: <b>Have we considered solar panels?</b> Headteacher Replied: Yes, PCC are now considering this for LA maintained schools as there could be a significant number on our roof. We may put these on the KS1 and KS2 hall, which would save us money in the long run.	
	A Governor asked: <b>Could we consider motion detective</b> <b>lights?</b> Headteacher replied: We are looking at this, and when we replace lights in the future, yes, this is an option we will take into consideration.
