PE/ Games

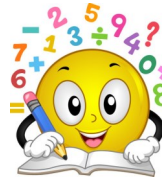
As sports people we will learn...

- To compare and sort 2D and 3D shapes.
- To subtract two 2-digit numbers using concrete and pictorial representations.
- To choose and use appropriate units to estimate and measure length/height to the nearest appropriate unit, using a ruler.
- To compare and order lengths and heights.

RE

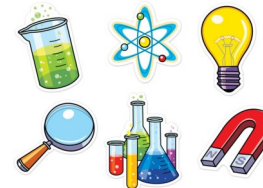
As thinkers we will learn...
