### As sports people we will learn...

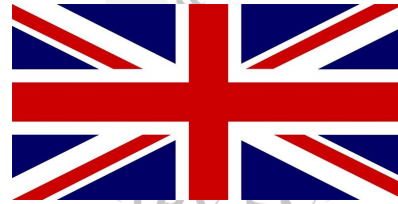
- To describe how the body feels before, during and after exercise.
