As people, we will learn....

- The effects of our behaviour on others.
- To follow rules and understand why they are important.
- To make healthy choices with food, drink and tooth brushing.
- To describe what makes a good friend.
- To find solutions when conflicts arise.
- To develop appropriate ways of being assertive.

## As home learners, we will learn...

- To read my decodable phonics book to an adult at home.

- To blend sounds into words.
- To read some common exception words.
- To form lower case and capital letters correctly.
- To spell words by identifying the sounds and then writing the correct letter shape.
