A WELCOME MESSAGE

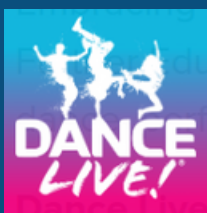

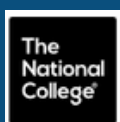

Out the Door!

It can be difficult getting ourselves and our children up and ready in the mornings, particularly when it's dark, wet and cold outside. If you're struggling to get your children moving in the mornings try these tips, rules and routines:

Ban screens in the morning – having a no-screen rule will ensure everyone is more focussed and on-task in the morning.

Try using **visual timetables or charts** to prompt independence and help children know what is happening next. It can help reduce the nagging in the morning and helps children follow a routine.

If mornings are still difficult, you could try linking the visual schedule to a **reward chart**. Every time they complete their morning routine, they receive a sticker or some sort of reward.

We hope you find this useful and it positively impacts your morning routine!
